Outcomes indicated that nurses and students were aware of culture, but had limited knowledge of cultural competence. Additional educational opportunities are vital to increase nurses' knowledge and skills regarding culturally competent care.

**The Impact of Cultural Competency Education in Nursing on the Demonstration of Culturally Competent Care** Apr 06 2022 Introduction. Culturally competent nursing care supports the achievement of optimal patient outcomes and addresses health disparities. Health disparities disproportionately affect minority patients resulting in poor patient outcomes, decreased medication adherence, ineffective communication, and decreased healthcare visits. A narrative review of the literature was conducted to explore current published evidence relevant to the impact of cultural competency education in nursing on the demonstration of culturally competent care. Methods. A review was conducted to identify literature published between 2015 and 2022. A total of 16 articles were selected for inclusion in the review. Results and Discussion. Synthesis of the selected articles yielded four emerging themes: incorporation of cultural competency in nursing practice guidelines, factors that impact cultural competency, efficacy of cultural competency education, and opportunities for improvement of cultural competency education. Although cultural competency education is central to nursing, variation exists among training programs. An individual's degree of cultural competency is impacted by numerous factors, including the level of cultural humility, awareness of implicit bias, and diversity in cultural education methodology. Additional research is needed to quantify the elements that comprise effective

cultural competency training. Conclusion. Cultural competence was associated with improved patient outcomes and increased patient satisfaction. However, current cultural competency education was deemed to be ineffective and in need of improvement.

The purpose of the project was to determine the best methods of analyzing the barriers and challenges encountered by nurses, and determine the most effective implementation tools to increase cultural competence in practicing nurses. The implementation method was a teaching session for nurses on cultural competence. The objectives of the teaching session were for the participants to be able to describe the components of culture and their importance in providing culturally competent care, and to gain awareness of their own cultural biases and prejudices. After the teaching session, the participants were able to differentiate between at least three different cultural aspects of care, and three predominant cultural groups in the workplace, and they scored a minimum of 85% on the post test. The conclusion of the project emphasizes the increasing need for cultural competence in nursing because the increasing population diversity in the U.S. In order to achieve this and change one's own cultural assumptions, nurses should expose themselves to different cultures. Also, it is important to adhere to a cultural model, such as Campinha-Bacote's Cultural Competence Model, that will help with gaining competence in this matter. In addition it is important to remember that change will be more effective and will have long-lasting effects when it is a whole-team approach, when it is continuous, and when it is planned in advance.
