Although CSCW may be considered a 'young' field, it has existed as something recognisably different from its 'parent' fields of research for at least a decade. This book will be of value to those who are relatively new to CSCW, both students and the more qualified, and to those with greater knowledge, because it collects and reports practical experience, which, at present, is in short supply in accessible form.
